Per OPPM 07-01, Guidelines for Immigration Court Cases Involving Unaccompanied Alien Children, the definitions for juvenile codes are:

J: a child in proceedings has a parent or legal guardian in the United States who is providing care and physical custody.

UJ: a child in proceedings meets the definition of an unaccompanied alien child – has no parent or guardian in the United States or no parent or legal guardian in the United States available to provide

J1: the child has been released from DHS custody or ORR custody to a sponsor, parent, or legal guardian or if the unaccompanied alien child attains the age of 18 while still in proceedings.

J2: all cases identified by the judge as falling under the asylum jurisdictional provision of the TVPRA
